Dr. Al-Delaimy, Professor, Division Chief of Global Health, University of California San Diego, presented on Somali/Refugee Mental Health. See attached PowerPoint.

No Place Like Home (Yes on Proposition 2) presented on the upcoming November 2018 Ballot Initiative:

Strunk gave brief history of No Place Like Home legislation and the road to and the need for an initiative.

Lauren Quinlan presented on history/facts about Prop 2. Prop 2 is a \$2 billion bond (to be repaid through the MHSA) that will fund new housing units and allow for update of current units. Services will be connected to housing using a "Housing First" model. Hope to achieve construction of 20,000 units.

Ann Miles presented on the joint Prop 1 and 2 campaign. Campaign is using a coalition-based program. Campaign is providing templates for email, social media, website, and direct endorsement requests.

No difference in guidelines/criteria/rules/funding from No Place Like Home vs. Prop 2

Members expressed general concern over the definition of “homelessness” in bill and initiative (cities do not count homeless in the same manner). There’s also concern about the ability to build so many units so quickly.

- MHAC-AB 2022 was signed into law. Mental Health Matters Day-will be held on May 22, 2019.
- CPA-AB 2943 was pulled over constitutional concerns; looking at new trend of “reintegrative therapy”
- NASW-CA-Midterm political field organizing campaign- “Obama 7” Contact Rebecca Gonzales at NASW for more information.
- SD Legal Aid-Education on repeal of Costa-Hawkins Law. Look into Prop 10.
- CBHPC-AB 2316 related to patient rights advocates was signed by the Governor. AB 2317, related to whistleblower protections was vetoed by the Governor. Last meeting of the year- October 17-19 in Folsom. Working on WET 5 year education plan.
- EMM-Distributed Suicide Prevention Toolkits.
- High Five for MH-looking to get recognition as May for MH Awareness Month.
- NAMI SD-Color Ball and Inspiration Awards on October 11, 2018.
- CAMFT-AB 2088 signed into law; awaiting news on AB 93.
